November 9, 2015**

AGENDA APPROVAL –Lund moved and Trevino seconded to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – None

Lund moved and Collard seconded to approve the minutes of October 12, 2015, as presented. Motion carried.

Case moved and Lund seconded to approve the bills in the amount of \$54,094.01, as presented. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Police Report – Chief Dood added to his written report and indicated it has a busy month.

Mike Vellanti, DPW Supervisor, added to his written report and reported on the progress of leaf vacuuming. He has worked with Jim Youngman to get his storage building doorway repaired.

Airport – Mike Matthews, Manager, no additions to his report. The airport needs a new flag.

Village Manager – Jake Eckholm reported on the announcement of Byrne Electric coming to Lakeview. He shared the Police Department was awarded a grant at the Community Dinner. Lakeview Drive has been paved.

The DDA Committee recently met. The Committee rejected a bid for a boat launch. The Committee accepted another boardwalk project, which includes the development of the Bollinger's Lot.

Mary Thomas, Medication Disposal Coalition of Montcalm County, presented Chief Dood with a plaque for the Police Department's participation of medication disposal.

Village Manager Eckholm introduced David Sanderson from Promo Quip, a new business within the Village. Their business manager, Cindy, was also introduced.

Village Manager Eckholm noted that Clark Newell has requested legal permission to drive on property where the water well house is located. Mr. Newell wants to expand ownership of his land and he requested a right of way. There was discussion of the right of way. Liability was discussed and it was noted that Clark's insurance would cover liability.

Lund moved and Huttinga supported to approve a right of way if Clark Newell purchases the M-46 property. Motion carried.

Information and Comments: Chief Dood noted Chuck Shaylor has been maintaining a memorial sign for Eric Johnson. Mr. Shaylor has asked Chief Dood to take over the maintenance of the sign. A new sign has recently been installed.
