REGULAR COUNCIL MINUTES  
September 14, 2015**

President Winter called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

AGENDA APPROVAL –Lund moved and Lobert seconded to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS – Paul Sieben, 21 Lakeview Drive, asked about paving Lakeview Drive.

**STANDING ITEMS**

Minutes –Lund moved and Case seconded to approve the minutes of August 10, 2015, as presented. Motion carried.

Bills – Lobert moved and Collard seconded to approve the bills in the amount of \$68,255.56, as presented. Motion carried.

**REPORTS**

Police Report – Chief Dood, did not have any additional items to add to his report. He will check on the ordinance for dumpsters within the Village.

DPW – Mike Vellanti, DPW Supervisor, noted his department has been chipping brush this week.

Airport – Mike Matthews, Manager, did not have any additional items to add to his report.

Village Manager – Jake Eckholm, talked about the project at the Pickle Docks. He also reported he has a cash offer for the Townline Lake House. Manager Eckholm spoke on a recent

municipal airport meeting, an application to the Lakeview Community Area Fund for a grant to assist in funding for police protection gear, and the status of the Pearl Street house (which has been sold to the Lakeview Elevator for the price paid).

Manager Eckholm noted the Village Office will be receiving a new phone system. Another note was made that the Memorial Tree project went well. The classmates, who are remembering those from their class that have passed away, will be placing a remembrance plaque near the tree. Manager Eckholm reminded the Council members he will be attending the ICMA Conference. Discussion occurred on the County Recycling bins. This situation is being monitored with cameras.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Townline Lake House offer was discussed. Lund moved and Lobert seconded to accept the cash offer of \$18,500 as presented. Motion carried.

Village Manager Eckholm presented a proposal and asphalt bids for the paving of Lakeview Drive. Todd Lincoln reported on the process he organized to include the residents on Lakeview Drive and the commitment sheets for their part in financing the project. Discussion included the thickness and fine grading of the asphalt.

Case moved and Trevino seconded to approve the paving of Lakeview Drive with the Village funding 75% of the bid price from Shooks Asphalt Co., Inc., and the residents of Lakeview Drive funding the remaining 25%. Motion carried.

At the request of a Village resident, the Council discussed bow hunting within the Village of Lakeview. The recommendation is to not allow bow hunting anywhere within the Village.

Lund moved and Lobert seconded to go into closed session at 8:16 p.m. Motion carried.

Lobert Moved and Lund seconded to resume regular session at 8:50 p.m. Motion carried.

Huttinga moved and Lobert seconded to give Village Manager, Jake Eckholm, a 10% pay increase. Motion carried.
